Susanna Elizabeth, but more agreeably known as "Charlotte Knight", after being (as is said) 20 years in keeping by John Lord Delaval, was married to him at Earsdon, 5 Jany, 1803. She was born 8 Nov 176-. "Little Charlotte, a slight genteel girl, good looking & very bewitching eye" She is stated to have had an aunt, Elizabeth Young, who from Lord Delaval has an annuity and a cousin, Young, a land surveyor in Essex. She had Ford Castle and Estate as her jointure and educated her brother's son, Thomas Knight, as a parson. She died at Matlock, 20 Aug, 1822. Will dated 26 Oct 1821. Pr Principal delegate of Archbishop of Canterbury 11 March 1823. Personal estate £7,000 on process? Of Canterbury. Income to brother Henry Knight of Aldgate for life and after his dc. ?all £100 fr ? c. lg. ?his suv'or. I have already provided for his son the Rev. Thos. Knight, rector of Ford - ultimate residue in trust for children of my said brother other than said Rev. Thos. Knight.

The marriage of Harold Strangeways Knight Gregson, youngest son of the late Henry Gregson, Deputy Lieutenant and J.P. of Lowlynn, Northumberland, and Miriam Jessie, youngest daughter of the late Anthony William Clarke, J.P. of Armathwaite Hall, Carlisle and Bishop Yards, Penrith, will take place at St Margaret's Church, Westminster, on October 6th.

Abt 1902, the Rev. William ?Greenwell? informed me that Thomas Knight was ?selected? by his aunt Lady Delaval who sent him to Cambridge with the intention of presenting him the benefice of Ford. On the death of the old Mr Marsh she offered the living to her nephew requiring him, on the security of the lands similar to those given to former rector, to raise no claim to certain disputed tithes. He refused and it was not until a few days before the presentation would ?lapse? to the bishops that she managed to present him unconditionally. Knight made no claim on the tithes so long as his aunt lived, but on her death, he raised against her successor (Lord Waterford) and received tithes valued at £800 p.a. which for many years ?
